1. The frame of the study visit

Study visit title:

From Soviet vasal to free democratic member of the Nordics and the EU.

Time and places

The 5-day study course takes place from Sunday to Friday, 18th – 23rd of May 2025.

2. Summary of the Erasmus+ mobility plan

Context

The course is part of the Erasmus+ Mobility project: "NGO cooperation for European diverse heritage and shared values (COOP), incl. four courses in the period: July 2024 – December 2025.

The mobility project is coordinated by NGO-Netværket for internationalt projektarbejde

Aim and objectives

The overall aim for this Mobility Project is to transfer new experiences and competences with social and green sustainability to our members from the Danish civil society.

The objectives are:

- to transfer experiences and good practice examples from other EU member states and to gain new inspiration and increasing innovativeness in our own activities, and
- to present good practices and methods in combining social and green sustainability, and thereby putting the green words into action without leaving no one behind.

Number and profile of participants

Max 8 participants.

The target groups are staff and volunteers that are active in the civil societies in the Danish Kingdom, and who have become members of the NGO-Network.

Rite Folk High School is a private independent institution, which is located in Rite municipality, Jekabpils Novads, Latvia.

The purpose of the institution is to support a system of adult education in Latvia by creating a Folk High School inspired by the Danish tradition of Grundtvig Folk High Schools. This means that the overall goal of the school must always be enlightenment of people in order to give the students the opportunity to develop authority, openness, energy and a strong commitment to democratic governance and values. The operation of the school is financed by voluntary contributions from members of the support circles in Denmark and Latvia, payment for courses and support from national, regional and local Latvian and Nordic governments. In addition, support from private funds.

The school building is a former primary school, which has been converted into a folk high school with 11 rooms, where it can accommodate from 2 and up to 8 people per. room. Max occupancy is 35-40 people, in addition there are classrooms, dining room and institution kitchen.

The sending association

The sending organisation is the NGO Network for International Project Work (NGO-Netværket for internationalt projektarbejde) - see <u>https://ngo-netvaerk.dk/</u>

The NGO Network was founded in March 2021 as an ideal and voluntary association. The purpose of the association is to develop a forum where active members of Danish civil society can exchange experiences, disseminate knowledge and support each other in developing transnational activities that can strengthen free and democratic associational life in the Nordic and European civil societies.

The association's activities may include knowledge sharing and exchange of experience, mentoring, courses and conferences, debate activities, publications and development work, both in the Commonwealth, the Nordic area, the Baltic Sea region, the European Union and wider international contexts.

In the first years, the NGO Network for international project work will offer:

- A series of short 1-hour online webinars for Danish NGOs with knowledge and experience exchange about developing the international project activities.
- More onsite theme meetings and events on the development opportunities with international networks and collaborative projects.
- International events, such as study tours, contact meetings and theme conferences.
- Counselling on finding foreign partners, preparing applications and coordinating international projects.

5. Practical information

Conditions and price

The course is free. The mobility grant can cover the travel costs, beds, and meals as well as the study programme and fee for the hosts. The Erasmus+ mobility grant will cover the following costs:

- The administration costs of proving the Erasmus+ application and reporting, planning the programme, preparing Mobility Agreements with all participants, booking travels and accommodation, and course evaluation.
- The participants' course fee for the 4 days programme which we must pay to our Latvian host organisations.
- The costs of a basic return flight ticket incl. hand baggage and up to 20 kg suitcase, but not extra costs for specific seat reservation, travel insurances, drinks, and meals during the flight.
- The rent of a minibus for local transport from the Airport to and from the hotel as well as local transport during the visits Tuesday Friday.
- Booking of beds for two nights from Sunday to Tuesday in single room (or double room if wished) in Riga, and three nights from Tuesday to Friday in single or double rooms at <u>Rite Folk</u> <u>High School.</u>
- Provision of main meals as breakfast, lunch, dinner, and coffee breaks all days, from Monday to Friday.

The participants shall only bring pocket money to cover their possible café visits in the free time, extra drinks during the common meals, costs of souvenirs, presents, etc.

Visa card can be used most places in Latvia, and it is easy to find cash machines in Riga Airport or in Riga city.
